

Breast cancer is the most common form of cancer in women in the United States. According to the American Cancer Society, 780 new cases of breast cancer will be detected in Delaware this year and 120 lives will be lost. Nationwide, there is a new diagnosis every three minutes and a death from breast cancer every 13 minutes. While advances have been made in prevention, diagnosis, treatment and cure, early detection still affords the best opportunity for successful treatment. Programs such as Helping Hands for Breast Health help ensure that all women have access to early detection information and options, even poor and medically underserved women.

“This year we will continue our efforts to educate and assist women with access to breast health and mammogram. We continue to do this with our community partners and will work closely with the local Avon representatives, senior centers and food pantries. Our program strives to help women continue to be screened annually. This is done through the written reminder system and phone call reminders,” says Nora Katurakes, manager of community outreach and education at Christiana Care.

Since 1993, the Avon Foundation, an accredited 501(c)(3) public charity, has awarded more than 1,600 grants to community-based breast health programs across the United States, including Helping Hands for Breast Health at Christiana Care. The Avon Foundation awards funding to beneficiaries ranging from leading cancer centers to community-based grassroots breast health programs to support breast cancer research and access to care.
