Christiana Care Health System Comforts Patients Through Launch of WXPN Musicians On Call

Program brings Live Music to Patient Bedsides in Delaware for First Time

(WILMINGTON, Del. – Oct. 20) <u>Christiana Care Health System</u>'s Wilmington Hospital and WXPN are teaming up with area musicians to bring WXPN Musicians On Call to hospital patients in Delaware for the first time.

Wilmington-based singer-songwriters John Flynn and Angela Sheik will perform for patients at Wilmington Hospital's Center for Rehabilitation and Acute Care for the Elderly (ACE) Unit following a launch event from 3 p.m. to 4:00 p.m., Wednesday, Oct. 22nd at the new Atrium at Wilmington Hospital.

The local WXPN Musicians On Call program is coordinated through Christiana Care's Volunteer Services and funded by Light Up the Queen Foundation and The Kenny Family Foundation, the charitable foundation run by the operators of the Kenny Family ShopRites of Delaware.

WXPN, the member-supported public radio station from the University of Pennsylvania, recruits and brings local musicians to perform for patients through the WXPN Musicians On Call program. These musicians will continue with weekly bedside performances for patients at Center for Rehabilitation and ACE Unit at Wilmington Hospital each Wednesday from 5:30 p.m. to 7 p.m.

"In our transformation of the Wilmington Hospital campus, we are continually looking for ways to improve the experience of our patients and their families," said Sharon Kurfuerst, Ed.D, OTR/L, FAOTA, senior vice president of administration at Christiana Care. "The WXPN Musicians On Call program provides comfort and joy to our neighbors by enabling them to hear live music right at their bedsides while we partner with them in their care."

Now entering its 10th year of service, the WXPN Musicians On Call program is a nonprofit initiative that has touched the lives of more than 70,000 patients and their families in six healthcare facilities throughout the Philadelphia region. Over the past decade, more than 200

volunteer musicians and guides have regularly participated in the program by giving weekly performances for patients.

"Music's ability to heal is real and powerful, and the Musicians On Call program makes a positive impact on so many people's lives," said Helen Leicht, WXPN Midday host and spokesperson for the WXPN Musicians On Call program. "We are thrilled to work with our Wilmington-based music partners like World Cafe Live and Gable Music to bring this unique and powerful program to the patients at Christiana Care."
